<sup>13</sup> Penal Code sections 664 and 459 taken together denote a felony conviction for attempted burglary.

<sup>14</sup> Penal Code section 666.5(a) enhances by changing the sentencing triad on a felony vehicle theft conviction, due to a prior felony conviction for vehicle theft.

<sup>19</sup> In this particular case Health & Safety Code section 11352 denotes a felony conviction for transporting fentanyl for sale. Likewise, Health & Safety Code section 11351 denotes a separate felony conviction for possessing fentanyl for purposes of sale. Finally, Health & Safety Code section 11378 denotes a felony conviction for possessing methamphetamine for purposes of sale.

<sup>20</sup> Vehicle Code section 31 denotes a misdemeanor conviction for providing false information to a law enforcement officer.

<sup>24</sup> This combination of Vehicle Code section 23152(b) and Vehicle Code section 23550(a) denotes a felony conviction for driving a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol .08 or greater having suffered at least three prior DUI convictions within the last 10 years.

<sup>25</sup> Vehicle Code section 14601.2(a) denotes a misdemeanor conviction for driving on a suspended license, with the basis for the suspension being a prior DUI conviction.

<sup>26</sup> Health and Safety Code section 11351, in this case, denotes a felony conviction for possession of fentanyl for purposes of sales.

Note: The realignment legislation changed the good time/work time custody credits that are "earned" by prisoners against the above sentences. By law each defendant is only required to serve one-half of the commitment noted or, put another way, 50% of the sentence imposed.

The **post-supervision** column indicates whether a sentence has been "split," meaning the defendant's overall sentence is split by order of the Court between time incarcerated in the county jail and time on mandatory supervision upon release. If the defendant's sentence is not split, then he or she will not have any probation or parole-like supervision upon completion of their full sentence.
