¹ Penal Code section 32, in the context of defendant Russo's prosecution, denotes a felony conviction for being an accessory (after the fact), meaning defendant Russo was involved with another person who was transporting fentanyl for purposes of sale; defendant Russo knew this other person was illegally transporting fentanyl for sale, yet defendant Russo nevertheless harbored, concealed or aided the perpetrator with the intent that the perpetrator avoid or escape arrest, trial, conviction, or punishment.

² Penal Code section 1320(b) denotes a felony conviction for willfully failing to appear in court after signing a written promise to appear.

³ Health and Safety Code section 11351 denotes a felony conviction for possession of controlled substances for purposes of sale. In this case, defendant Ashurst was convicted of two counts of this crime – one involving fentanyl and the other heroin,

⁴ Health and Safety Code section 11378 denotes a felony conviction for possession of controlled substances for sale; in this case, the controlled substance was methamphetamine.

⁵ Penal Code section 236 denotes a felony conviction for false imprisonment.

⁶ Health and Safety Code section 11379(a) denotes a conviction for transporting a controlled substances for the purposes of sale; in this case, the controlled substance was methamphetamine.

¹⁰ The combination of Penal Code sections 459 and 460(b) charges denotes a felony conviction for burglary in the second degree, meaning a non-inhabited dwelling burglary. Could be a commercial business or a locked vehicle.

¹¹ Penal Code section 4573(a) denotes a felony conviction for smuggling contraband, normally drugs, into the jail.

¹² Penal Code section 530.5(a) denotes a felony conviction for a type of one form of identity theft.

¹³ Penal Code section 666.1 denotes a felony conviction for petty theft with at least two or more prior theft convictions. This charging section was passed into law by the voters approving Prop 36 in the November 2024 general election.

¹⁴ Penal Code section 666.5 is a sentencing enhancement to a conviction for vehicle theft; it denotes a prior conviction for the same offense and, if admitted, increases the sentencing triad for the latest conviction.

¹⁵ Health and Code section 11351, in this case, denotes a felony conviction for possession of fentanyl to sell to others.

¹⁶ Penal Code section 1320.5 denotes a felony conviction for “bail jumping” – posting bail to ensure an appearance in court and then willfully failing to appear.

²³ Health and Safety Code section 11378 denotes, in this instance, a felony conviction for possessing methamphetamine with the intent to sell same to others.

²⁶ The combination of Penal Code section 666.1 and section 664 denotes a felony conviction of attempted petty theft of property with two or more prior larceny convictions (in this case, five prior convictions).

²⁸ Vehicle Code section 23152(a) denotes a misdemeanor conviction for driving a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol.

²⁹ Vehicle Code section 23247(e) denotes a misdemeanor conviction for driving a motor vehicle without a court or DMV-ordered ignition interlock.

³⁰ Vehicle Code section 14601.2(a) denotes a misdemeanor conviction for driving a motor vehicle with a suspended license due to a prior DUI conviction.

³¹ Penal Code section 148(a) denotes a misdemeanor conviction for resisting or delaying a peace officer in the performance of his or her duty.

³² Health and Safety Code section 11395(b), in this context, denotes a felony conviction of the voter-approved Proposition 36 mandated drug treatment charge for possession of hard drugs having suffered two or more prior hard drug convictions. This defendant declined drug treatment and, instead, opted for a mitigated Realignment County Prison (local jail) sentence.

Note: The realignment legislation changed the good time/work time custody credits that are "earned" by prisoners against the above sentences. By law each defendant is only required to serve one-half of the commitment noted or, put another way, 50% of the sentence imposed.

The **post-supervision** column indicates whether a sentence has been "split," meaning the defendant's overall sentence is split by order of the Court between time incarcerated in the county jail and time on mandatory supervision upon release. If the defendant's sentence is not split, then he or she will not have any probation or parole-like supervision upon completion of their full sentence.

³³ Penal Code section 490.4(a) denotes a felony conviction for unlawful participation in an organized retail theft ring.

³⁴ Penal Code section 182(a) denotes, in this context, participation in an unlawful conspiracy to commit theft.

³⁵ Penal Code section 4502(a) denotes a felony conviction for possession of a deadly weapon in the jail.
