⁴ Penal Code section 1320.5 denotes a felony conviction for bail jumping.

⁵ Penal Code section 1320(b) denotes a felony conviction for willfully failing to appear in court after having signed a written promise to appear.

⁶ Penal Code section 12022.1 denotes a special allegation that the defendant committed a new felony offense while a prior felony charge was still pending.

⁷ Health and Safety Code section 11378 denotes a felony conviction for possession of methamphetamine for purposes of sale.

⁸ Health and Safety Code section 11379(a) denotes a felony conviction for transporting methamphetamine for commercial purposes.

⁹ Health and Safety Code section 11395(b), a new statute enacted by Proposition 36, denotes a felony conviction for unlawful possession of a hard drug with two or more prior convictions involving hard drugs.

¹⁰ Penal Code section 496(d) denotes a felony conviction for knowingly possessing a stolen vehicle.

¹¹ Vehicle Code section 23152(b) with a section 23550(a) enhancement denotes a felony conviction for driving a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol concentration of .08 or greater, said defendant having suffered three or more misdemeanor convictions in the last ten years for driving under the influence.

¹² Penal Code section 666.1 denotes a felony conviction for petty theft with two or more prior theft convictions.

¹³ Penal Code section 4573(a) denotes a felony conviction for attempting to smuggle drugs into the jail.

¹⁴ This combination of Penal Code and Vehicle Code sections denotes a felony conviction for attempted vehicle theft.

¹⁵ Penal Code section 487(d)(1) denotes a felony conviction for grand theft auto.

Note: The realignment legislation changed the good time/work time custody credits that are "earned" by prisoners against the above sentences. By law each defendant is only required to serve one-half of the commitment noted or, put another way, 50% of the sentence imposed.

The **post-supervision** column indicates whether a sentence has been "split," meaning the defendant's overall sentence is split by order of the Court between time incarcerated in the county jail and time on mandatory supervision upon release. If the defendant's sentence is not split, then he or she will not have any probation or parole-like supervision upon completion of their full sentence.
